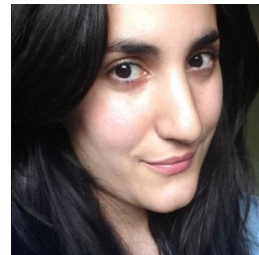


Imran Yusuf

The Days of Joy project is run by the Palestine Trauma Centre in Gaza by local mental health professionals, play workers and drama therapists.

These professionals go out each week into different refugee camps, schools and open spaces in the urban centres of Gaza and provide play, drama and sporting activities for children.
